The governor announced on February 28 that the indoor mask mandate for schools will be removed at midnight on March 11, a Friday. Beginning with Monday, March 14, masks will no longer be required by the state to be worn in schools. It will be up to schools and other organizations to make their own policies. Grace Academy will not require masks at school; however, we will follow the requests of parents who still want their child to wear them.

Please note that we will not treat it as a school discipline issue, but as something that we refer to the parent if their child is not following the parent’s wishes.

We will also work with the student body to ensure they know that they are to respect the varied decisions of other families. This will be a new and unfamiliar situation for many students, who will now see some students masked and others not. Respect for others will be expected and enforced.

There is no doubt that this will be a difficult transition for some and easy for others. We are working to create a community that is respectful and supportive of the desires of others who make different choices. Unfortunately, the COVID pandemic has brought enormous division among people who previously had none, and this is just the latest chapter. Fundamentally, we celebrate the return of authority from the government to its proper place with families, but we will need to work to make it a smooth transition.
